## Safety Tips

How to handle used batteries?

Store them high up, out of reach of children, in a dry place at room temperature.

Cover 9V and button cell batteries with tape;

Handle damaged, swollen or leaking batteries with care.

## Collection points

What should I do with my used batteries?

Drop them off:

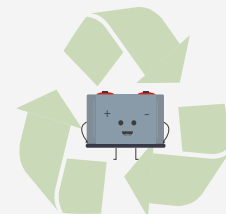
At your resource center;

During mobile collections organized by SuperDrecksKëscht;

In stores that provide collection barrels for used batteries.



## Extend the life of batteries



Some batteries can be prepared for reuse, repurposing, or remanufacturing.

## Environmental Impact



Improper disposal of batteries causes soil and water pollution and poses a risk to human health.

## What does this symbol mean?

The crossed-out wheeled bin symbol shown on batteries means that they must not be disposed of with household waste, as they contain hazardous and polluting substances.
